

MODULAR COMBINATIONS FOR THE DESIGNATED EQUINE CERTIFICATES

The following Equine modules are available, either as free-standing modules or as part of the Certificate in Advanced Veterinary Practice and the designated Equine Certificates.

All of the following modules are worth 10 credits or 100 notional study hours.

There will be six designated Equine certificates for the Certificate in Advanced Veterinary Practice. Candidates wishing to work towards a particular designated certificate will be required to take the following combinations of modules:

For all Equine Certificates, candidates must take the A module in Professional Key Skills, the B module in Clinical Key Skills, and the B module in Equine Practice. The remaining C modules may be taken in the following combinations:

Certificate in Advanced Veterinary Practice (Equine Practice)

Certificate in Advanced Veterinary Practice (Basic Equine Practice)

Please note that this is a general certificate pathway for candidates who wish to work towards a general certificate in Practice. The CertAVP (Basic Equine Practice) certificate is another possible structured Equine Practice route. This does not replace any existing routes or preclude any future further routes to the Equine Practice certificate.

The certificate is designed to be taken by someone in largely but not necessarily exclusively equine practice. The successful candidate will be a competent equine clinician with the broad skill base necessary to deal with the rigors of first opinion practice.

The Certificate in EP covers an enormous breadth of knowledge – *but not to the same depth as the individual modules in each specific subject area*. There may therefore be considerable overlap of material between some Cert EP modules and other ‘free standing’ ones.
